REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2001

Pursuant to Section 16C of the *Chiropractors Act 1964*, I report hereunder on the Board's activities for the year 2000/2001.

1. CONSTITUTION

The Chiropractors Registration Board is constituted under the provisions of Section 9 of the *Chiropractors Act 1964* (the Act) as a body corporate.

2. GOALS

The primary goals of the Board are:

- a) to ensure the administration of the Act; and
- b) protect the public from any unprofessional, improper or incompetent practice of chiropractic.

3. FUNCTIONS OF THE BOARD

The Board is directly responsible to the Minister for Health for all matters relating to the administration of the *Chiropractors Act 1964* and the *Chiropractors Registration Board Rules 1966* (the Rules).

The functions of the Board are:-

- to maintain the Register of chiropractors;
- to deal with applications for the registration of chiropractors pursuant to the provisions of the Act and the provisions of Mutual Recognition (Western Australia) Act 1995;
- to investigate complaints made in relation to the practice of chiropractic and to take disciplinary action if appropriate;
- to ensure chiropractors are informed of any changes to the Act and the Rules.

4. MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD

Membership of the Board is prescribed under Section 7 of the Act.

The Board consists of five members appointed by the Governor and of these:-

- a) one will be a legal practitioner nominated by the Attorney General;
- b) two will be registered Chiropractors nominated in the prescribed manner by the WA Branch of the Chiropractors' Association of Australia;
- c) one will be a registered Chiropractor nominated by the Minister;
- d) one will be a person nominated by the Minister to be a representative of consumer interests.

7. REGISTER OF CHIROPRACTORS

As at June 30, 2001 there were 214 names on the Register which had been issued with licences to practise in Western Australia during the year then ended. During the year thirty three (33) applications for registration were approved. Of these nine (9) applied under Mutual Recognition with twenty four (24) applying under the Act.

8. REGISTRABLE QUALIFICATIONS

Qualifications recognised by the Board are those obtained from the Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology or from institutions holding prime accredited status in accordance with the Australasian Council on Chiropractic Education (ACCE) requirements. The only other Australian course to have attained prime accredited status by ACCE is that from Macquarie University. In addition, the Board has accepted applicants who have undertaken the clinical proficiency examinations conducted by the Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology provided the proficiency level achieved was equal to that of current graduates from that Institute.

9. FEES

The following are the current registration fees:-

Certificate Fee	\$30.00

An increase in the annual licence fee to \$375 was gazetted on 18^{th} August 2000. This was the first increase in annual licence fees since 20^{th} August 1993.

10. AMENDMENTS TO THE ACT AND RULES

There were no amendments to the Act during the year ended 30 June 2001.

The Chiropractors Act is currently under review by the Health Department of Western Australia.

11. PENALTIES

The penalties which the Board may impose on registered chiropractors are reprimand, suspension, cancellation of licence or order the chiropractor to pay a penalty not exceeding \$5,000.

12. COMPLAINTS

During the year the Board dealt with six (18) new complaints against registered chiropractors.

- a) Complaints regarding breaches of the Advertising Regulations (The Board considered responses in relation to these complaints and on the basis of undertakings made, resolved that inquiries were not warranted)
- b) Complaints referred to the Office of Health Review
 (Following consent received by the complainants, in each case the Board has forwarded these matters to the Office of Health Review.)

- c) Complaints regarding touting or canvassing for patients 2
 (The Board received complaints in relation to this matter and resolved that an inquiry was not warranted.)
- d) Complaints regarding respect of Modesty for the Patient

 (The Board held an inquiry in relation to this matter and found the Chiropractor guilty of misconduct in failing to respect the modesty of the patient)
- e) Ongoing Complaints 5 (Complaints that have been recently tabled but complaint not yet resolved)

13. CONFERENCES AND MEETINGS

The Western Australian Board attended the 2000 Australian Conference of Chiropractors and Osteopaths Registration Boards (ACCORB) held in Christchurch, NZ in September 2000. The Board was represented at the Conference by Mr R Scott, Mr S Farrell, Mr B Goodreid, Mrs V Frazer, Mr K Spencer and Mr C Emmott.

Among the items being considered at the ACCORB Conference were:-

- National Accreditation and Examination Body
- Trans Tasman Mutual Recognition
- Uniform Standards
- Use of Specialist Titles
- Internship/Probationary Registration

The Australian Conference of Chiropractors and Osteopaths Registration Boards (ACCORB) Conference was held in Perth, WA on the 14-16 September 2001. The Board was represented at the Conference by Mrs Valerie Frazer, Mr R Scott, Mr S Farrell, Mr B Goodreid, Mr K Spencer and Mr C Emmott.

14. PROPOSAL FOR A SINGLE ACCREDITATION BODY FOR AUSTRALIAN AND NEW ZEALAND CHIROPRACTIC COURSES

Discussions have been occurring with other Chiropractic Registration Boards within Australia and New Zealand regarding a proposal for the establishment of a single accreditation body for Australian and New Zealand Chiropractic courses.

These meetings led to the formation of an informal joint Working Party with Registration Boards, the CAA (Australia) and other interested parties.

Mr R Scott attended a consensus meeting on behalf of the Board to develop a model for this Accreditation Body. Progress on this model has been delayed due to difficulties in addressing the concerns of the Chiropractors and Osteopaths Registration Board of NSW.

15. ASSESSMENT OF OVERSEAS PERSONS FOR SKILLED MIGRATION

The Chiropractors Registration Board has been gazetted as the body responsible for the assessment of overseas persons for skilled migration. This task was previously undertaken by NOOSR who has been devolving this process to professional bodies, where appropriate. Mr Bevan Goodreid and Mr Colin Emmott attended a Professional Body Seminar which was held on 9 April 2001, where all professional bodies where updated on recent changes. Following this meeting Chiropractors Boards around Australia agreed on a process of assessment.

Following agreement on the assessment process Mr Ken Spencer and Mr Colin Emmott attended a meeting in Brisbane to develop an examination as part of the assessment process.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus views and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the requirements of the Chiropractors Act 1940.

The financial report covers the Chiropractors Registration Board of Western Australia as an individual entity. The Board is incorporated in Western Australia under the Chiropractors Act 1940.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the Board in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

a) Income and Expense Recognition

Licence fees are brought to account as income on a time expiry basis under the accruals method of accounting.

Expenses are brought to account under the accruals method of accounting in the year incurred.

b) Taxation

The income of the Chiropractors Registration Board of Western Australia is exempt from tax pursuant to Section 24AQ of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

c) Goods and Services Tax

Revenue and expenditure is stated net of the amount of the goods and services tax (GST). The Australian Taxation Office has advised and ruled that registration fees are exempt from GST. The Board, however, pays GST on its supplies and obtains credit refunds quarterly upon lodgement of its Business Activity Statement.

d) Registrars Fees Expense

This expenditure represents the Board's administration and secretarial fees budgeted and approved by the Board and paid as a retainer for year ended 30 June 2001. It includes the provision of fully serviced office facilities such as management and administration together with accounting, secretarial staff, typing, computer facilities, telephone attendance, reception, public access, rental for office space and meeting facilities, newsletter, educational presentations, attendance at professional conventions and sub-committee meetings.
